****** Day 4 ******

1. Read Exodus 4:30-31.

Then Aaron spoke to the people and told them everything the LORD had told Moses. Then Moses did the miracles for all the people to see, ³¹ and they believed what they had heard. Then the Israelites understood that the LORD had seen their troubles and had come to help them. So they bowed down and worshiped God.

- 2. Looking back to the previous days, we learned that Moses and Aaron both heard the Lord speak to them and they obeyed. What did the Lord ask each of them to do?
- 3. Because Moses and Aaron obeyed God, the Israelites started to understand two things about the Lord. What were these two things?
- 4. What did the Israelites do after they realized the Lord had seen their troubles and had come to help them?
- 4. Ask Your Parents: Can you think of a time when you heard the Lord speak to you, you obeyed and because of your obedience, someone responded to the Lord?
- 5. Pray: Gracious Lord, you ask us to do things so others might come to know you and worship you. May we also grow in our desire to worship you and to see others worshipping you.



Exodus 4:18-31

1. Read Exodus 4:18-20.

Then Moses went back to Jethro, his father-in-law. Moses said to him, "Please let me go back to Egypt. I want to see if my people are still alive." Jethro said to Moses, "Go in peace." Then, while Moses was still in Midian, the LORD said to him, "It is safe for you to go back to Egypt now. The men who wanted to kill you are now dead." So Moses put his wife and children on the donkey and returned to Egypt. He carried his walking stick with him—the walking stick with the power of God.

- 2. What was the mission Moses' was going to accomplish?
- 3. Ask Your Parents: What mission has God given you?
- 4. Moses was returning to Egypt to complete the mission. Who did Moses take with him?
- 5. Pray: Father God, we know you have given us the mission to make disciples of all the nations. Help us to fulfill that mission and to know the specific ways you desire us to complete that mission. Show our family how each person is to be part of that mission, for no one is too small to accomplish the tasks the Lord give us.

****** Day 2 ******

1. Read Exodus 4:21-23.

While Moses was traveling back to Egypt, the LORD spoke to him, "When you talk to Pharaoh remember to show him all the miracles that I have given you the power to do. But I will cause Pharaoh to be very stubborn. He will not let the people go. Then you should say to Pharaoh, 'This is what the LORD says: Israel is my firstborn son. And I am telling you to let my son go and worship me. If you refuse to let Israel go, then I will kill your firstborn son.'"

- 2. When does the Lord speak to Moses in this passage?
- 3. You may have been told that prayer is simply talking with God. What happens when you talk with your parents? Do you do all the talking?
- 4. Think about your time talk with God. When do you talk to God? When you talk to God do you listen to Him speak back to you?
- 5. Ask Your Parents: How do know when God is speaking to you?
- 6. Pray: Precious Lord, you desire to talk with us all day long. Increase our desire to talk with you. Help us to hear and know your voice.

****** Day 3 *****

1. Read Exodus 4:27-31.

The LORD had spoken to Aaron and told him, "Go out into the desert and meet Moses." So Aaron went and met Moses at the Mountain of God. He saw Moses and kissed him. Moses told Aaron everything the LORD had commanded him to say and all the miracles he must do to prove that God had sent him. So Moses and Aaron went and gathered together all the elders of the Israelites. Then Aaron spoke to the people and told them everything the LORD had told Moses. Then Moses did the miracles for all the people to see, and they believed what they had heard. Then the

Israelites understood that the LORD had seen their troubles and had come to help them. So they bowed down and worshiped God.

- 2. On day 2 we read about the Lord speaking to Moses. Who did the Lord speak to in this passage?
- 3. What did Aaron do after the Lord spoke to him?
- 4. Are you like Aaron? The Lord gave him directions and he immediately did what the Lord asked him to do. Do you immediately do what your parents or teachers or coaches ask you to do? Why or why not?
- 5. It is easy to hear your parents/teachers/coaches when they are speaking. Obeying your parents immediately is very important because it is preparing you to be able to hear and obey the Lord just like Moses and Aaron. Do you want to hear the Lord speaking to you? Do you want to obey when He speaks to you?
- 6. Ask Your Parents: What has God spoken to you about this week? How did you act in obedience?
- 7. Pray: Father God, you want us to be obedient to you. Help me want to obey you more and more every day.
